Memphis Minnie was born June 12, 1897, in Memphis, Tenn. She was the daughter of a coal miner and a seamstress. She learned to play guitar from her father, who was a blues player and a well-known musician in Memphis. She was one of the first women to play guitar in the South. She was a very popular blues singer and guitarist in Memphis and other parts of the South. She recorded her first records in 1920 and continued to record until 1942. She was a very successful blues artist and is considered one of the greatest blues singers of all time.

In 1920 Memphis Minnie moved to Chicago and played there with the Red Stone Blues Band. She was a member of the band for several years. In the early 30s she recorded several records for the Bluebird label. She was a very popular blues singer and guitarist in Chicago and other parts of the North.
